Local women make face masks to benefit individuals with developmental disabilities



MENTOR - Lake County women tanded together May 14 on a mission to make face masks for individuals with developmental disabilities who attend adult services programs at the Lake County Board of Developmental Disabilities (LCBDD) / Deepwood.

The women who volunteered their time and talents were either members of the Deepwood staff or the LCBDD Board of Directors The group consisted of just 10 women to respect the state's social distancing parameters, but that didn't hinder them from meeting their goal of making 70 masks and 15 kits with fabric and elastic to make more masks if needed.

County Board Adult Day Support (ADS) programs were required to closs on March 20 due to guidance issued by the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities (DODD) related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

"It was good for my mental health to spend a day away from my computer and give tack to our community," Folkar-Byrne said.

Masks were provided to individuals as they began returning to adult day support programs May 18.
