Agency Resources

During the month of August, 24 children were evaluated for Ohio EI services with 22 of those children qualifying for services. Of these qualifying children, most of the children were assigned to work with Developmental Specialists as their Primary Service Providers based on the identified delays and needs from the family.

Broadmoor School and the Transportation Department started off the school year being trained on The Aegis System, Positive Behavioral Intervention Supports (PBIS), and annual training requirements. In the first nine days of school, fifty-three staff members were "caught" using adapted language and building the rapport of The Broadmoor Bobcat Way: Be Kind, Be Safe & Try Your Best.
