<u>Superintendent's Report – October 2025</u>

Community Awareness/PR Opportunities/Collaborations

Broadmoor completed its semi-annual Active Shooter Emergency Alert Radio Test in collaboration with Mentor Police Dispatch. Broadmoor administrators participated with the Mentor Police Department gaining insight into how emergency alerts are received and processed by dispatch. Meanwhile, the test at Broadmoor School was conducted using the active shooter alert system that was installed last year. This coordinated effort continues to enhance emergency preparedness and strengthen communication between the school and local law enforcement.

Therapy dog handler, Joe Trask, who visited Broadmoor School for decades with five different therapy dogs & positively impacted the lives of hundreds of students, passed away in September. In his memory, a memorial brick – donated by the Broadmoor Family Network – will be placed in Deepwood Foundation's Paver Garden at the Clarke Family Activity Center.

In February 2025, LCBDD hosted an ICF Regional Training at VGC with Milestone Autism Resources partnering with DODD on the best practices for implementing the OISP for ICFs and QIDPs videotaping the full day training. In September of 2025, Milestone Autism Resources featured the videotaping of LCBDD on their website. On the Milestone Autism Resources website, there are two parts of the OISP training that was held at VGC in the Training Room with an additional Administrator Training video.
